Healthcare is Michigan's leading source of private-sector jobs.



High-quality, Affordable Care is Delivered

Michigan hospitals are highly efficient. Costs rank 9.7% below the national average. Lower costs translate into annual savings to employers of at least \$500 million.

The MHA Keystone Center works with hospitals to develop and implement strategies to engage patients and families, prevent harm and collect and analyze data to support evidence-based best practices.

State funding for healthcare in small and rural communities is more critical than ever before. More than 43% of Michigan counties currently have no obstetrical services, so expectant parents must travel to other counties to deliver babies.

Since its launch in April 2014, the Healthy Michigan Plan has provided health insurance to more than 579,000 working men and women who didn't previously have coverage. While it will help reduce uncompensated patient care costs facing hospitals, it will not eliminate the problem.
