EMPOWERING PRESCRIBERS & PHARMACISTS TO PREVENT OPIATE ABUSE

On June 19, 2017, Lt. Governor Brian Calley announced an investment to integrate the Michigan Automated Prescription System (MAPS) directly into electronic health records and pharmacy dispensation systems of hospitals, physician groups, and pharmacies across the state. Outside of fees your vendor may require, the State of Michigan's investment will cover the integration and applicable licensing fees incurred through August 31, 2019, facilitating instant MAPS access for your prescribers and pharmacists

MAPS tracks the dispensing of schedules 2-5 controlled substances in Michigan. Prescribers and pharmacists use MAPS data to assess patient risk and prevent drug abuse and diversion at the prescriber, pharmacy, and patient levels.

This integration effort will provide a valued and in-demand service to your prescribers and pharmacists by directly integrating a patient's controlled substance history into your software platform through Appriss Health PMP Gateway[®]. This service streamlines clinical workflow for hospitals, physician offices, and pharmacies by providing a single point of access to MAPS as well as other states' prescription drug monitoring programs. NarxCare, an Appriss Health developed product, will also be included. This tool equips prescribers and pharmacists to identify possible drug misuse or abuse of prescription drugs through additional analytics of the PMP data.
