MARK YOUR CALENDAR



Last day to register to vote in the 2020 General Election unless registering in-person with a local clerk.



Election Day – polls open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

In the case of an unplanned event, such as a sudden illness, the birth of a baby or a hospitalization, you can request an emergency absentee ballot from your local clerk's office up until **4 p.m. on Election Day.*

NO REASON ABSENTEE

All registered voters are now able to vote by mail (no reason absentee ballot) and citizens can register to vote up to and on Election Day at their local clerk's office. To register to vote or to apply for an absentee ballot, complete an online application at Michigan.gov/Vote or contact the local city or township clerk.
