

Michigan Hepatitis A Outbreak Update for Clinicians



The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will host an hour-long webinar focusing on hepatitis A. The webinar will provide updates on the status of the hepatitis A outbreak in Michigan, focusing on: case data review, risk factors, and hospitalizations. An interactive discussion of ongoing screening, vaccinations, and response strategies will occur.
