This request for funding (RFP) is designed to solicit proposals for new or ongoing programs and interventions that work to eliminate racism in nursing. **The Commission defines racism as:** Assaults on the human spirit in the form of actions, biases, prejudices, and an ideology of superiority based on race that persistently cause moral suffering and physical harm of individuals and perpetuate systemic injustices and inequities. (National Commission to Address Racism in Nursing, 2021)

The Commission is now accepting proposals for evidence-based programs and interventions aimed at dismantling racism in nursing in one of the following pathways:

- Diversity, Belonging & Inclusion Initiatives
- Anti-racism Education, Immersion & Training
- Patient & Family Outcomes
- B.I.G. (Belonging, Innovation & Growth) Ideas

The Commission encourages proposal submissions from academic institutions, healthcare organizations, schools of nursing, hospitals, professional nursing organizations, ambulatory and outpatient care settings. The Commission is not able to consider proposals from individuals, consultants, or contractors.
